Apply now for the Allan Robertson Grants 2017

Young peatland researchers and young industry employees (normally under the age of 30) can now again apply for the IPS Allan Robertson Grants for Research Students and Young Professionals in Peatland Management. The grants were established in memory of Allan Robertson, First Honorary President of the IPS, in 2015. They can be used for research or practical work in managing peatlands or peat industry, for your project work, for equipment or travelling. Depending on the amount of sponsors, IPS will give out at least 2-4 grants this year. Undergraduates are ineligible. The winners of the grants will be announced at the Annual Convention of the IPS in Aberdeen, **28 - 31 May 2017**. Payment will be made by bank transfer after that event. Successful applicants must agree to provide a report on their project or work that will be published in the IPS magazine Peatlands International and/or give a presentation of it at an international IPS event at the latest 12 months after the grant funding has been paid to them. World Wetlands Day 2017 – Map your activities!

Today, on **2 February**, we will, as in the years before, celebrate World Wetlands Day to raise global awareness about the value of wetlands for humanity and the planet. This year's theme is "Wetlands for Disaster Risk Reduction" and of course the topic involves especially mangroves, rivers and floodplains, inland deltas, coral reefs and peatlands. The Convention on Wetlands was adopted on 2 February 1971, in the Iranian city of Ramsar on the shores of the Caspian Sea. Since 1997, the Ramsar Secretariat provides outreach materials to help raise public awareness about the importance and value of wetlands.

"Wetlands play an important role in reducing the impact of extreme weather events such as floods, droughts and cyclones. Wetlands act as a natural sponge, absorbing and storing excess rainfall and reducing flooding. During the dry season, they release the water stored, delaying the onset of droughts and reducing water shortages. The frequency of natural hazards has more than doubled; the majority are climate and weather related." (Ramsar Secretariat)
